




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

Also, it was interesting to see that there was an Australian Company called AUSTRAL operating in Alabama producing Aluminum war ships for the American Government
























Dave Hill and Dave McClellan both retired corvette engineers.



Wendy & I have always wanted to go to the Raptor Bird Sanctuary nearby. Off we went and were lucky enough to have a private tour of the Sanctuary










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After viewing the cars, we then returned back to the Hilton where the 4 of us enjoyed a lovely diner together


Sydney Breakfast run Stonehouse.

On arrival, we will collect the cars and drive to a unique little town called Sheffield where all the buildings are covered in murals, we will stop for morning tea there.













After the train trip, we will travel towards Hobart, stopping at Derwent Bridge




where we will view The Wall in The Wilderness, this is the work of one man who has carved the most incredible sculptures that you will ever see. So bring your cameras.






