

TEAKWOOD STEERING WHEELS

History and Identification



Freemans Design Charlotte, NC 704-510-2250

Introduction

Freemans Design is a Wood Working company located in Charlotte, North Carolina. We have been fabricating Reproduction '65-'66 Corvette Teak Steering Wheels since 2000. These wheels also fit 1963 thru 1968 Vettes. In addition, we created a smaller 15" Teak Wheel which is the same size as the '69 thru "75 stock Vette Steering wheel. This 15" wheel will also fit the '63 thru '68 Vettes and is a favorite among guys that want a little extra room behind the Steering Wheel. Finally, we have began production of the Teak Steering Wheel that was installed by GM on the five '63 Grand Sports. This adds a nice "missing touch" to a Grand Sport Replica and is available only directly from Freemans Design. Photos of this wheel are shown on the last page. Our client list include:

Teakwood Steering Wheel origin

During what many considered to be the last "great era" of automobile production and before the Feds moved in with their regulations, Corvette offered a really unique 65 and 66 option. It was to be a real European-style wood Steering Wheel. The idea for its production was to be for the all new 1963 Stingray. There were several proposals but these designs had serious problems. The final design was not completed until the 1965 model year was ready. The patent drawings for the wheel are located in the back of this booklet. The company that was chosen to produce this option for GM was The Howard Miller Clock Company. They are a family owned business located in Zeeland, Michigan. Established about 50 years ago, this company was well known for its high quality clocks and woodworking. Howard Miller Company was furnished the metal cores and produced each wheel for \$20.00. Chevrolet charged \$48.00 for this option, Production in 1965 was around 2,200 wheels and 1966 was around 3,900. It's not clear why this option only lasted 2 years but it is believed the Feds thought the wheel was unsafe. It was an interesting option in a unique era. Its sad to see that we will never see the likes of the 1960s again in automotive development.

Reproduction Teak vs. original GM Teak

When it comes to Teak Wheels, the "big" question is how do you determine if a wheel is a Repro or an original? Unfortunately one "particular" feature that will give you a definite answer. You will have to examine several features. First you will need to verify all of the physical characteristics featured on the next page. These features are not easy to duplicate but can be done.

Physical Characteristics of a Teakwood Steering Wheel See photos below

- 1. Made of Genuine Teakwood.
- 2. The Stainless Steel Spoke (core) is the same as the 64-66 Steering Wheels.
- 3. On the front side there are 9 individual 6 ½" long individual pieces of teakwood.
- 4. In between each piece of teak is a 1/32" thick shim.
- 5. On the outermost diameter of the wheel is a 3/16" wide strip of rosewood.
- 6. On the innermost diameter of the wheel is another strip of 3/16" rosewood.
- 7. On the back side of the wheel are the same teak and rosewood pieces along with "finger grips" cut in.
- 8. There are 3 individual sets of finger grips. One set contains 22 grips and the other 2 sets contain 13 finger grips each.

Upper photo is a Freemans Design reproduction. Lower photo is a GM original.






Second, you will need to examine the finger grips on the back side of the wheel. This is the hardest part of the wheel to get right. Correct grips are around 3/32" deep and do not have any sharp edges. Correct grips are cut at a compound radius. Meaning you will not only see a radius as you view the wheel from the edge, but this radius is in an arc as it goes from the outside diameter to the inside diameter. The first picture below, is a GM original.

The center picture below is from an awful reproduction.

The lower picture is of a Freemans Design Repo.




<u>Third</u>, you will need to examine the Stainless Steel core to see if it is original or reproduction. The picture on the left is the one-piece 64-66 core. GM cores have "brush mark" finishes that runs parallel to each spoke on the front side. The back side has a smooth "satin" polished finish. One definite feature that identifies a repo core from an original core is the "radius" located on the inside edge of the inner slots, see arrow. Repo cores will have a 45 degree chamfer. This radius would be too expensive to reproduce. Note that someone can use an old original core to build a wheel, but that doesn't make it a GM original.





Finally, If a wheel passes all of the test, you will have to look at the wheel and see if it looks like it has been around fo 40 years. This is absolutely the toughest part in determining if the wheel is original or not and I'm not sure I can teach this part part of the test. An original will, because of its age will have all of the teak turn to one consistant color. If a wheel has wood segments of different shades of teak, then it is not an original. There will not be any distinct darker grain showing in the teak segments. If there is some pieces of splintering missing, it should look as though it was worn away with time instead of someone recently gouging it out to try fooling someone. A reproduction will have a distinct "fresh cut " piece of wood look to it. The color of a recently restored original will have a color which I can only describe as the look of Grandma's cornbread. For this seminar I will be passing around 3 Repo's and 3 originals for examination. One final note is that I ocassionally run across a piece of fresh teak that has the same color as a restored original, which if put on an original core, would be impossible to tell from an original. To demonstrate this, the picture below has three GM original teaks and one of my Repo Teaks. At the end of the seminar I will tell which is mine.


